FROM FR. PETE:

The Feast of the Immaculate
Conception, Monday, December 8 is a
Holy Day of Obligation. Priests are not
permitted to offer an Anticipatory Mass
on Sunday evening since that is a
Sunday of Advent. Mass will be offered
on Monday at 7:00 a.m. giving people
plenty of time to get to work or school. I
will ask our visiting priest, Fr. Louis, if
he has time to offer an evening Mass on
Monday. If he does I will announce it at
this weekend's Masses. You might also
check the Mass schedule in Sheridan.

An Advent meditation from St. Irenaeus, bishop and martyr.

The Lord, coming into His own creation in visible form, was sustained by His own creation which He Himself sustains in being. His obedience on the tree of the cross reversed the disobedience at the tree in Eden; the good news of the truth announced by an angel to Mary, a virgin subject to a husband, undid the evil lie that seduced Eve, a virgin espoused to a husband.

As Eve was seduced by the word of an angel and so fled from God after disobeying His word, Mary in her turn was given the good news by the word of an angel, and bore God in obedience to His word. As Eve was seduced into disobedience to God, so Mary was persuaded into obedience to God; thus the Virgin Mary became the advocate of the virgin Eve.

Christ gathered all things into one, by gathering them into Himself. He declared war against our enemy, crushed him who at the beginning had taken us

captive in Adam, and trampled on his head, in accordance with God's words to the serpent in Genesis: "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and her seed; he shall lie in wait for your head, and you shall lie in wait for his heel."

The one lying in wait for the serpent's head is the One Who was born in the likeness of Adam from the woman, the Virgin. This is the seed spoken of by Paul in the letter to the Galatians: "The law of works was in force until the seed should come to whom the promise was made." He shows this even more clearly in the same letter when he says: "When the fullness of time had come, God sent His Son, born of a woman." The enemy would not have been born of a woman because it was through a woman that he had gained mastery over man in the beginning, and set himself up as man's adversary.

That is why the Lord proclaims
Himself the Son of Man, the one who renews
in Himself the first man from whom the race
born of woman was formed; as by a man's
defeat our race fell into the bondage of death,
so by a man's victory we were to rise again
to life.

Welcome Father Louis Guardiola! Fr. Louis comes to us from the Fathers of Mercy located in Kentucky. We have been blessed to have the Fathers come to us for Advent and Lent for the last six years in a row.

Fr. Louis will preach the weekend Masses and then begin our Advent Parish Mission on Sunday, 7:00 p.m. The mission will be held each evening, Monday thru Thursday, at 7:00 p.m. Among the topics he will address are: the power of the Eucharist and the Mass; the things that prevent us from experiencing the power of the **Eucharist, the Eucharist as answer** to our personal problems; how the **Eucharist can transform our lives** and how one should respond to Christ's invitation to "watch with Me one hour."

Many of you enjoyed Fr. Louis when he came to us a couple years ago. DVD's and CD's will be available. They make wonderful Christmas presents and "stocking stuffers."

If anyone wishes to invite Fr. Louis out for lunch / dinner please feel free to invite him.
