FROM FR. PETE:

Why keep the Sabbath Day holy as we are commanded by avoiding unnecessary work? Perhaps a story from Jewish rabbinical writings will shed some light on the matter. The following comes from the Talmud, Midrash Asseret ha-Diberot. It's a wonderful story that has much to teach if one is willing to consider it carefully.

A Disciple used to plough with his cow and she became accustomed to rest on the Sabbath. He grew too poor, however, to keep her, and sold her to a pagan. When the Sabbath came, the cow refused to pull the plough. He came to the Disciple and complained. The Disciple said to his cow: "You may work when your master works."

The creature understood that her former master wished her to work, and she began to pull. The pagan inquired what the Disciple had told her. On receiving the information, he said to himself: "If a beast without reason desires to rest on the Sabbath, should I, a reasoning being, do less?" He became a proselyte and was called Rabbi Haninia ben Turta (the Son of a Cow).
